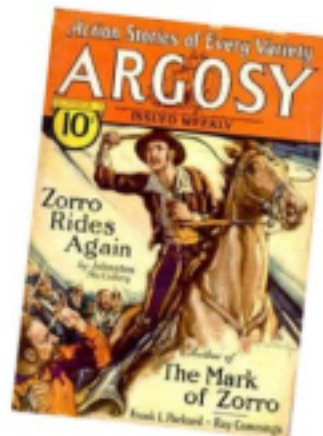
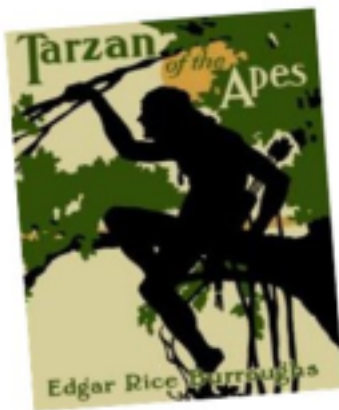
- Late 1800s – more books available because of high-speed printing presses

 - Illustrated stories called comics

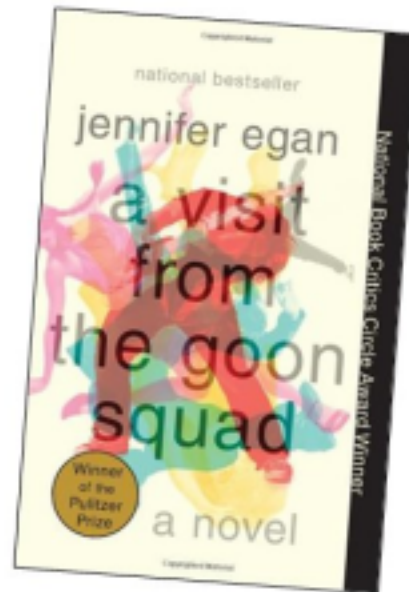
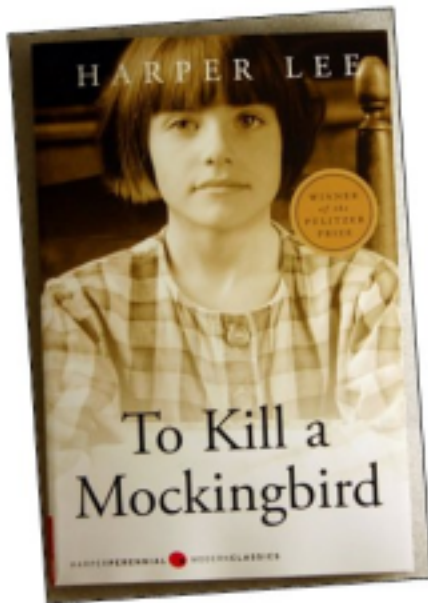


The first comic strip featured a wildly popular character – The Yellow Kid

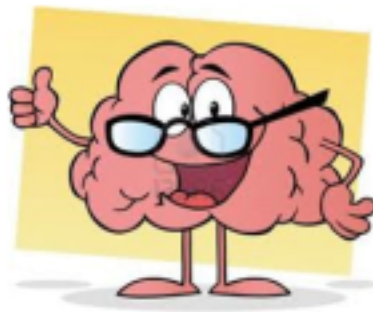
- In the United States, Massachusetts passed a law requiring children to attend school in the 1850s.
